Since 1998 he is full Professor of Economics at the University of La Réunion (France) from which he has been President (Vice-chancellor) from 2004 to 2008. From 2009 to 2011 he joined IRD (French national Institute of Research for Development).

His **research interests** are on macroeconomics, economic globalisation, economic development, developing countries and economic history. He has published many papers in international journals (such as Oxford Economic Papers, Macroeconomic Dynamics, Journal of Economic Surveys, History of Economic Ideas), in collective books (Edward Elgar Publishers) and has co-published books on the effects of economic globalisation (Nova Science Publishers).
